Anand-388121, Gujarat to increase admission capacity from 50 to 60 seats (instead of 50 to 100 seats) in existing BAMS Course and to start new PG courses in 2 subjects i.e. (i) Rognidan (05 seats) and (ii) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) and denial of permission to start 05 new PG courses i.e. (i) Panchakarma-05 seats, (ii) Swasthviritta-06 seats, (iii) Dravyaguna-06 seats, (iv) Rasa Shashtra & Bhaishajya Kalpana (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita (05 seats) from the academic session 2014-15 under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970- reg.

In continuation to the Department's letter of even No. dated 12.06.2014 wherein a Letter of Intent was issued to the college with respect to the proposals submitted to the Central Government as cited above, I am directed to say that after careful consideration of recommendations of the CCIM, submission made by the college during the hearing and observation of the Hearing Committee and undertaking dated 24.09.2014 in terms of the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970, submission made by the college during the hearing and relevant regulations made thereunder and approved norms for academic session 2014-15, which were circulated vide Department's letter No.R.11011/10/2013-EP (IM-1) dated 17.06.2014 to all the ASU Colleges, Universities and State Governments and also available on Department's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>; permission of the Central Government is hereby granted to the Principal, Govindbhai Jorabhai Patel Ayurveda College and Research Centre & Surajben Govindbhai Patel Ayurveda Hospital, New Vallabh Vidyanagar, Behind G.I.D.C., Dist. Anand-388121, Gujarat to increase admission capacity from 50 to 60 seats (instead of 50 to 100 seats due to shortage of required no. of total teachers and Higher faculty) in existing BAMS Course and to new proposed PG courses in 2 subjects i.e. (i) Rognidan (05 seats) and (ii) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) and denial of permission to start 05 new PG courses i.e. (i) Panchakarma-05 seats, (ii) Swasthviritta-06 seats, (iii) Dravyaguna-06 seats, (iv) Rasa Shashtra & Bhaishajya Kalpana (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita (05 seats) due to non-availability of required no. of total eligible teachers and higher faculty from the academic session 2014-15 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970. Therefore, the college may take admissions in the above-mentioned increased

2. This permission to to increase admission capacity from 50 to 60 seats in existing BAMS Course and to start new PG courses in 2 subjects i.e. (i) Rognidan (05 seats) and (ii) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) for the first admitted batch of 2014-15 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970.
3. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers, as prescribed in the relevant CCIM Regulations, are in position before the admission of the students in the above-mentioned courses is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.
4. Further, to obtain the permission for academic session 2015-16 onwards to take admissions in the above said permitted new PG courses and increased intake capacity in UG course, the college shall fulfil all the requirements of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder by 31.12.2014 and fulfilment of the conditions intimated by Department vide letter no.R.12011/01/2005-EP(IM-1) dated 18.07.2014 will be verified by the CCIM.

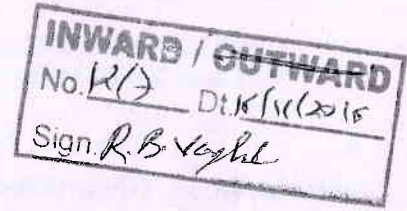

Sub: Grant of conditional permission for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and denial of permission for 10 seats in 02 PG courses namely (i) Rog Nidan evum Vikriti Vigyan (5 seats) and (ii) Kayachikitsa (5 seats) to the Govindbhai Jorabhai Patel Institute of Ayurvedic Studies and Research Centre, B/H G.I.D.C., New Vallabh Vidyanagar, Taluka-Distt. Anand-388121, Gujarat under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 for the academic session 2016-17 – reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No. R.12011/01/2005-EP (IM-1) dated 01.10.2015 related to admission matter for the year 2015-16 intimating certain shortcomings for rectification for consideration of the case for the 2016-17 session.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 01-02.06.2016 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to this Ministry. On examining the same, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the criteria of required teacher student ratio & at least 1HF+1L in addition to UG requirement in both PG department, required Clinical Registrars, sub-divided constructed area of Kitchen, Physiotherapy unit in hospital, Area of herbal garden & Demonstration room in herbal garden etc. as per MSR. Therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 14.10.2016 to present the case.

3. The recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM and the observations of hearing committee based on submission made by the college during hearing have been carefully examined in terms of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approval of the Hon'ble MoS (IC) for the UG/PG course(s) for grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2016-17 vide Ministry letters No.R.11011/01/2016-EP (IM-1) dated 12.08.2016 & 31.08.2016 (available at Ministry's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>) and it is found that the College is fulfilling the notified and approved criteria as follows:-

- (i) Teachers: For UG course: 100% eligible teachers, 15 Higher Faculties (Professor/Reader) in 14 Departments, 1P/R+1L in each of 13 Departments & 1P+1R+1L in Kayachikitsa and 1L of Bandhit for up to 60 UG seats and 09-part time teachers;
- (ii) Beds in hospital:
 - a. Minimum 60 beds in hospital of college for UG course in case of up to 60 intake capacity;
 - b. Minimum 100 bedded hospital for PG Colleges of Ayurveda and additional beds in 1:4 student-bed ratio for each PG clinical seat over the total requirement of beds for UG students intake capacity;
- (iii) Minimum 120 patients per day in OPD during the year 2015 for up to 60 UG seats;
- (iv) 40% bed occupancy for UG College and 50% for Colleges with PG course/s in IPD during the year 2015; and
- (v) Equipment and instruments: Minimum 90% of required equipment as specified under the schedule VII of MSR.

4. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to **grant of conditional permission** to **Govindbhai Jorabhai Patel Institute of Ayurvedic Studies and Research Centre, B/H G.I.D.C., New Vallabh Vidyanagar, Taluka-Distt. Anand-388121, Gujarat for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and deny the permission for 10 seats in 02 PG courses** namely (i) Rog Nidan evum Vikriti Vigyan (5 seats) and (ii) Kayachikitsa (5 seats) for the academic session 2016-17 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 subject to condition that the college shall fulfill the following requirements by 31st December, 2016 which will be verified for granting permission from the academic session 2017-18 (a copy of Assessment sheet of CCIM is also enclosed):

- i. The college shall obtain the NABH accreditation for the Hospital within one year and the NAAC accreditation for the College within two years from the issuance of the permission letter and the college shall submit its compliance to this Ministry as well as to the CCIM within specified period;
- ii. all the Minimum Standard Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012" read with amendment Regulations of 2013 by 31st December 2016 to get permission for a period not exceeding five years. Failing which, as per Sub-regulation (4) of Regulation 3 of Regulations namely the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012" read with amendment Regulations of 2013, "All the existing colleges, which are not able to achieve full compliance of the requirement as specified in these regulations by the 31st December, 2016, shall be denied permission from academic year 2017-18 onwards and action as envisaged under section 21 of the Act shall be initiated against all such colleges apart from rejection of their applications under sections 13A or 13C, which have been under consideration by way of conditional permissions or denials"; and
- iii. all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*.

4. However, on the examining the case, it was observed that college is not having required teacher student ratio & at least 1HF+1L in addition to UG requirement in both PG department, required Clinical Registrars, sub-divided constructed area of Kitchen, Physiotherapy unit in hospital, Area of herbal garden & Demonstration room in herbal garden etc. as per MSR. Therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 14.10.2016. The college through its representatives appeared before the Hearing Committee. In view of the observation of the hearing committee based on submission made by the college during hearing and the recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM, it can be understood that as per the notified and approved criteria for 2016-17 session as mentioned in para - 3 above, the college has not produced sufficient documents to substantiate their claim of having required numerical teacher student ratio & at least 1 HF + 1 Lecturer in addition to the UG requirement for conditional permission in Rog Nidan department; 1HF + 1 Lecturer in addition to the UG requirement for grant of permission for a period not exceeding 5 years in Kayachikitsa & Rog Nidan departments; 01 Clinical Registrar in the hospital for beds of clinical PG seats in Kayachikitsa; subdivided constructed area of Kitchen & Physiotherapy Unit in hospital and area of Demonstration room in Herbal Garden as per MSR. It has, therefore, been decided to deny the permission for 10 seats in 02 PG courses namely (i) Rog Nidan evum Vikriti Vigyan (5 seats) and (ii) Kayachikitsa (5 seats) for the academic session 2016-17.

6. The fulfillment of the conditions attached to the permission given above may be made within the specified time period and compliance report should be submitted to the Ministry of AYUSH endorsing a copy to the CCIM also. The CCIM will verify by means of an inspection that the conditions have been fulfilled and submit a report in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the session 2017-18.
